5.0 Non-Policy

5.1 Bylaw Review Committee: Council Rules for E-voting

Lutes briefly described the process of member notification and consultation which was initiated on December 22 2014 via an *eBlast* followed by *eNews* reminders. Member feedback to the Council Rules for E-Voting has been modest (seven emails were received from six members). The Council Rules have not been amended based on the feedback.

MOTION: That council approves:

- 1. The rules for e-voting for council elections and bylaw amendments, as found in the December 17, 2014 memorandum at 2.0 and 3.0 respectively, to take immediate effect; and
- 2. That these rules be formatted as appropriate for publication and published on the AIBC web site.

5.2 Associates Task Force Report (ATF)

Hendriks summarized that the motion completes the work of the Associates Task Force. The subsequent work to implement the motions becomes operational.

MOTION: That council approves:

- 1. That regulatory requirements be established for all associates to disclose their AIBC registration status to clients and authorities having jurisdiction prior to providing independent design services.
- 2. That an ongoing engagement strategy be developed with Retired Architects AIBC.
- 3. That should the first motion succeed that council acknowledge the thorough work of the Associates Task Force, that their work is substantially complete, and that the task force be closed.

- 5.3 Stakeholder Engagement Final Report
 - 5.3.1 Diverse Membership Working Group

Jahedi indicated that the final stakeholder engagement report recommendations were found to be in alignment with current initiatives and results of the Diverse Member Working Group survey. The following nine recommendations were made as a result of the Diverse Membership Survey results:

- 1. The AIBC should analyze intern architect and registration statistics annually and report back to AIBC Council.
- 2. The survey should be modified as necessary and re-issued at a minimum of five year intervals to the membership. The AIBC should monitor the survey findings (i.e. the rate at

- which interns' complete the IAP) to ensure the effectiveness of measures taken by the AIBC and other regulators, and architecture firms.
- 3. Through the annual statistical analysis, monitor the long term effect of the completion rate of the ExAC. Assist with connecting interns to form study groups for the ExAC.
- 4. A review of the AIBC website to be conducted periodically to ensure clarity of information pertaining to the Internship in Architecture Program (IAP) and its requirements to become an architect.
- 5. The AIBC should develop a stronger relationship with BC's school of architecture the University of British Columbia (UBC) School of Architecture and Landscape Architecture (SALA).
- 6. The AIBC and the other regulators should investigate the possibility of acquiring the specific CERB experience hours by alternative processes.
- 7. The AIBC encourages interested architectural practices to form an "Intern Friendly" initiative, to encourage the support of interns within firms, and to bring back the value in registration.
- 8. The AIBC should encourage "best practices" for architectural firms to:
 - Tangibly acknowledge the transition from Intern Architect to Architect,
 - Establish clear policies regarding support for IAs and monitoring IAs as they proceed to licensure,
 - Provide a specific array of support options to the IA at time of hiring, and
 - Cultivate a culture of mentorship that is accessible to interns.
- 9. The AIBC should position itself as a leader in the national initiative begun in the CACB/CALA Validation Conference held in Québec in September of 2014.

MAIN MOTION: The Diverse Member Working Group (DMWG) would like Council to endorse the recommendations proposed in the Diverse Membership Survey Report:

- The DMWG would refer Recommendations one through six (of the Diverse Membership Survey Report) to AIBC staff as operational tasks.
- The DMWG would focus on Recommendations seven and eight through the next Initiative Intern Friendly Initiative.
- The DMWG would request Council to push forward with Recommendation nine.

MOTION TO AMEND: That the wording in the Main Motion be amended to change 'AIBC staff as operational tasks' to 'the CEO for his consideration and appropriate action'.

5.3.3 Strategic Engagement Steering Committee

Condon summarized that the council submission identifying next steps for responding to the stakeholder engagement final report recommendations is constructed in three themes – Public Outreach and Education, Act Renewal, and Diverse Membership.

MAIN MOTION: That Council receive the AIBC Engagement 2.0 – Final Report and that:

- a) The Governance Committee be requested to provide recommendations for the establishment of a committee focused on defining the AIBC's approach to Public Outreach and Education, including an appropriate engagement strategy;
- b) The Act Review Working Group be requested to provide recommendations related to Act Renewal issues
- c) The Diverse Membership Working Group be requested to provide recommendations related to Intern Architect and diverse membership issues.
- d) That the CEO be requested to review recommendations related to operational issues and to take appropriate action; and,
- e) That the Strategic Engagement Steering Committee work in cooperation with the CEO to develop a communication plan for this report.

MOTION TO AMEND: To strike b) and c) from the Main Motion.

AMENDED MAIN MOTION: That Council receive the AIBC Engagement 2.0 – Final Report and that:

- a) The Governance Committee be requested to provide recommendations for the establishment of a committee focused on defining the AIBC's approach to Public Outreach and Education, including an appropriate engagement strategy;
- b) That the CEO be requested to review recommendations related to operational issues and to take appropriate action; and.
- c) That the Strategic Engagement Steering Committee work in cooperation with the CEO to develop a communication plan for this report.
