**NOTICE OF INQUIRY**

**TAKE NOTICE** that the council of the Architectural Institute of British Columbia (the "AIBC") has ordered an inquiry by a disciplinary committee into a complaint against you, an associate of the AIBC, to be held at 100 – 440 Cambie Street, in the City of Vancouver, in the Province of British Columbia, **on January 30 and 31, 2019 at the hour of 9:30 a.m.** for the purposes of taking evidence or otherwise causing an inquiry to be made with respect to the allegations herein pursuant to the *Architects Act*, RSBC 1996, c 17 as amended (the "*Act*"), the Bylaws of the AIBC ("Bylaws"), AIBC council rules and/or the AIBC's Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct ("Code").

**AND TAKE NOTICE** that the allegations against you are that:

1. Contrary to Bylaw 34.5, and council ruling (e), you acted unprofessionally, dishonourably and/or in a manner reflecting unfavourably on the profession of architecture by, during the AIBC's mandatory continuing education reporting period ending on June 30, 2018, submitting overstated or otherwise inaccurate reports to the AIBC when you knew or ought to have known that the number of learning units you were claiming was greater than the amount actually earned. Particulars include one or more of the following:
  - i. For the AEC Daily course "High Performance Barrier Wall Systems Using Insulated Metal Panels", you claimed two learning units when it was described by the provider as a one-hour program;
  - ii. For the AEC Daily course "How To Treat Concrete", you claimed two learning units when it was described by the provider as a one-hour program;
  - iii. For the AEC Daily course "Specifying Stock Components for Architectural Metal Work", you claimed two learning units when it was described by the provider as a one-hour program;

- iv. For the AEC Daily course “Overview of Firewalls and the Use of Glass-Mat Gypsum Shaftliner Panels”, you claimed two learning units when it was described by the provider as a one-hour program;
  - v. For the AEC Daily course “Moisture Protection for Concrete and Masonry”, you claimed two learning units when it was described by the provider as a one-hour program;
  - vi. For the AEC Daily course “Choosing GFRC Glass Fiber Reinforced Concrete: Modern Materials for Classic Design”, you claimed two learning units when it was described by the provider as a one and one-half hour program; and/or
  - vii. For your submission related to an email titled “Excel Dryer Checks In At Fairmont Hotel”, you claimed two learning units when this submission related to a four-paragraph email.
2. Contrary to Bylaw 30.2, Bulletin 80 and their council rules, for the reporting period ending on June 30, 2018, you failed to obtain and report the required learning units and pay the Council-mandated fine by the specified deadlines, including within the three-month grace period provided in Bulletin 80.
  3. Contrary to Bylaw 34.5, and council rulings (f) and (g), you acted unprofessionally, dishonourably and/or in a manner reflecting unfavourably on the profession of architecture by failing to provide a substantive response, or any response at all, to the investigation of AIBC complaint file 19.08, including failing to provide a substantive response, or any response at all, to AIBC communications that required a substantive response on one or more of the following dates: May 8, 2019; June 19, 2019; July 19, 2019; August 13, 2019; August 14, 2019; August 19, 2019; and August 23, 2019.

**AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE** that you, **Marque Curzon-Thompson Architectural Technologist AIBC**, have the right, at your own expense, to be represented by counsel at the inquiry by the disciplinary committee and that you or your counsel shall have the full right to cross-examine all witnesses called and to call evidence in defence and reply in answer to the allegations.

**AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE** that in the event of your non-attendance at the inquiry, the disciplinary committee may, upon proof of service of this Notice of Inquiry upon you, proceed with the taking of evidence or otherwise ascertaining the facts concerning the allegations, your absence notwithstanding, and may make its findings on the facts and its decision without further notice to you.

**AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE** that at the conclusion of the inquiry, if the disciplinary committee determines that you:

- i. have been unprofessional;
- ii. contravened the *Act* or Bylaws;
- iii. have been negligent or guilty of misconduct in the execution of a duty of office;
- iv. are incompetent, unfit or incapable of practising architecture; and/or
- v. are an architectural corporation ceasing to meet qualifications for registration under the *Act*;  
then

The disciplinary committee may make one or more of the following orders:


- i. A reprimand;
- ii. Suspension from practice for a specified period of time;
- iii. Removal of your name from the register of the AIBC;
- iv. Imposition of a fine of up to \$10,000; and

The disciplinary committee may also direct that certain costs of the inquiry are payable to the AIBC by you, in the amount and within the time specified by the disciplinary committee.

Enclosed with this Notice of Inquiry are sections 46 to 57 of the *Act*, and Bylaws 37.0-38.1.
